Managing your group

It is important to us that your group enjoys visiting Turner Contemporary. It is also important that all our visitors are safe and enjoy their experience, and that we take care of the art works on display.

Here are a few simple guidelines that will help you to have a successful visit:

- Supervising adults are responsible for the care, welfare, behaviour and discipline of your group. Your group must be supervised at all times, at the recommended minimum ratios:
 - Age 0 - 2: 1 adult to 3 children
 - Age 2 - 4: 1 adult to 4 children
 - Age 4 - 8: 1 adult to 6 children
 - Age 8 - 12: 1 adult to 8 children
 - Age 12 - 18: 1 adult to 10 children
- We accept a maximum of 33 students in the gallery at a time. Please split your classes into smaller groups of up to 15 when navigating the gallery (unless on booked a Turner-led guided tour). Our gallery spaces are not that big so it is a more enjoyable experience for your students and other visitors if the students move about in smaller groups.
- Please do not bring food or drink into the galleries.
- Please do not touch the art works in the exhibition as it can damage them.
- Please leave bags and coats in the lockers when you arrive. If available we may be able to provide a space to store belongings.
- You may take photographs in some exhibitions for personal non-commercial use, but please check with a member of staff upon arrival and please do not use a flash.
- We would really like you to draw in the galleries, but please only use dry materials. If there are a lot of people around an artwork, please wait until they have moved on so that you can get the best view.
- Our friendly Engagement Assistants will be very happy to answer any questions your group may have during their visit and tell them more about exhibition.

Code of Conduct

We want the Turner to be a safe, welcoming environment for anyone who spends time here. Abuse, violence, harassment or discrimination of any kind are not acceptable. If we think you are behaving in a way that risks the comfort and safety of other people or artworks, you will be asked to stop and may be told to leave the building.
